THE BASICS

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

While Supportive Services for Veteran Families is funded by the Department of Veteran Affairs, the criteria for military service is not the same. Veterans must meet income eligibility, which is set by federal guidelines, and must be at risk of losing housing or have already lost housing.

WHAT DO WE OFFER?

We know that one-size-fits-all solutions don't work for housing. Instead we work with each enrolled Veteran to leverage their strengths and support them in the ways that are needed. Enrolled Veterans receive highly-individualized services, which could include help with security deposits, rental assistance, transportation, child care, referrals to available resources, connections to medical care, and so much more.

HOW LONG IS THE PROGRAM?

Each Veteran receives services and support that meets their needs. For some Veterans, getting housed and starting a new job might take a few weeks, while others might need more time to work on obtaining benefits or reaching the goals they have set.
