The Gale Databases

It's time for a reminder about the <u>Gale databases</u>, a wonderful resource offered through a link on the Weston Public Library website. The Statewide Database Licensing Program provides Oregon residents with this access. Gale contains a variety of databases offering magazine, journal, and news articles, reference eBooks, statistics, images, audio, and video content. Included are student favorites like <u>Gale In</u> <u>Context</u> (very helpful for writing research papers) and newly designed databases like <u>Gale Presents: Peterson's Career Prep.</u>

You will find the Gale databases on the library website under resources. Your login is your library card number. If you can't find (or don't have) a library card, call the library and we will set you up. Once you have accessed the database, look around to see elementary, middle and high school resources as well as many subject headings. You can

read your favorite magazines and many newspapers here as well.

From full-text journal articles and newspapers to archives and eBooks, there is a resource in the Gale Databases to meet every need. Call the library at 541-566-2378 or stop in if you need help.



Andrew F. Kees was born in Washington Co., Pennsylvania in 1817 and died in Umatilla Co., Oregon in 1886. In 1860, he married Nancy Osborne (a survivor of Whitman Massacre) and they settled 2 miles south of Weston. From his farmland Mr. Kees deeded 1 and 9/16 acres for a cemetery site in 1875.

All official records of the Blue Mountain Cemetery were destroyed. Fortunately, Mrs. E.C. Miley and Mrs. O'Neal spent many days researching and reestablishing the county records as complete as possible. The list of burial sites on the website is a compilation of their efforts.

Information on Burials including photos of headstones, some obituaries, and other related historical information can be found on this website. There is also a map on the website.

The original website was a labor of love by Bob Gilliland. It was a miracle that it could be recovered from an archive website with only a few items not recoverable as the domain expired.
