#### Mayor's Corner - January 2019

I continued to be amazing and humbled by the kindness and love seen in our community (and Athena, too!). From the Giving Tree to the 4th and 5th Grade Food Drive and the individuals who quietly share, support, and love this town, there is much good to be found here in Weston. I am so thankful to live in a community like this. From the bottom of my heart, THANK YOU!

We anticipate a lot of activity in Weston this year: a bridge replacement, a major street improvement, and I still have high hopes for faster internet!! Updates in this newsletter and at Council meetings are always available, but if you have specific questions, please route them through City Hall.

On a personal note, I want to share with my community my current health journey. Five years ago I had surgery for stage 1B cervical cancer. It was believed that surgery completely removed the cancer and in June I was considered cured. Recently, after several medical tests, it was discovered that the cancer has returned. Localized, recurrent cervical cancer is treatable and my treatment includes additional surgery and radiation.

I will be having surgery in January and radiation in February. I will continue to serve as Mayor and continue to advocate for rural communities like Weston at the local, State, and Federal levels, but I want my community to know the circumstances surrounding the current state of my health.

There are many in our community and surrounding area dealing with crises, medical or otherwise. I encourage each of us to continue to support one another, care for one another, and keep showing the kindness and generosity that I have seen in the past.

The staff, crew and volunteers of Medic 400 would like to wish you all a Merry Christmas and a Happy, Safe and Healthy New Year in 2019. This year we have set a record by responding to 265 runs with a few days left to go in December 2018. We are very proud of the fact we were able to respond quickly and a few times we were able to staff a second ambulance. A big thank you to all our staff and volunteers!

There was a public informational meeting in Weston on December 11, 2018. The meeting was well attended by community members and directors from the East Umatilla County Rural Fire Protection District, Helix Rural Fire Protection District, the City of Athena and the East Umatilla County Ambulance Area Health District. Two speakers from Special Districts of Oregon gave a presentation on their experiences with agency consolidation in Lane County.

The above agencies are exploring a possible cooperation agreement between agencies to improve efficiencies and service. Public input is welcome. Comments and suggestions can be submitted to this agency at the above address or the other local agencies listed.
