

# Heritage Station Features Weston

Heritage Station, the museum of the Umatilla County Historical Society, with our cooperation has created an exhibit featuring Weston! This exhibit includes many historical photos of Weston; some you have seen in our library and others that may be new to you. Other features of the Weston exhibit include documents and information about Eastern Oregon State Normal School, the brickyard, and businesses that existed in the early days. You may also see photos and documents of Weston Leader newspaper editor Clark Wood, and author of *Oregon Detour*, Nard Jones. Museum curators have incorporated pictures and information about what is currently happening in Weston. When you see the exhibit you'll feel proud of our community!

Other interesting exhibits at Heritage Station are the historic Byrd School, the pioneer homestead Fix Cabin and outbuildings, and the 1909 train depot.

The museum is located at 108 SW Frazer, and open hours are Tuesday through Saturday from 10-4.

#### East Umatilla County Ambulance Area Health District What: CPR & "Stop the Bleed" Training \*\*\* Free to the public \*\*\* When: Saturday, May 12, 2018 10AM till 3PM Where: Weston-McEwen High School - Commons 540 E Main Street Athena, OR 97813

What: This is a free American Health & Safety Institute (ASHI) Health-care Provider based CPR1 training course open to the public. There is no cost for participation in the training, and the knowledge you obtain could save a life. Upon completion of the course, participants may choose to receive a certification card through ASHI for a processing fee of \$20.00.

"Stop the Bleed" is also free training open to the public and is part of a national awareness campaign to provide training and encourage bystanders to become trained, equipped, and empowered to help in a bleeding emergency before professional help arrives. No matter how rapid the arrival of professional emergency responders, bystanders will always be first on the scene. A person who is bleeding can die from blood loss within five minutes, therefore it is important to quickly stop any blood loss. This lifesaving training aims to provide those nearest to someone with life threatening injuries to provide immediate care.

How: Please register in advance by calling the EUCAAHD office at (541) 566-3813. Please leave your name and return telephone number, and we will return your call. Class size may be limited by the number of participants and the number of available CPR mannequins. Walk-in participants are welcome on the day of the course if class space is still available.

Who: Training is available to anyone; however, participants need to expect to exert a moderate level of physical activity while performing CPR compressions. Training will be provided by your local Medic 400 Ambulance crew of volunteer medical professionals. Reserve your spot today! (541) 566-3813

**Dog Licenses** – The City requires that dog owners obtain a license for pets over 6 months in age. As a public health measure, the license may be used until the dog's vaccinations expire at which point the owner must renew the license and present proof that the dog's vaccines have been updated. The City requires (hat businesses obtain a license to operate in Weston city limits, including businesses operating out of a temporary lo-cation during special events. or box. Don't be late. We must close on time. Contact person: Greg Phillips 503-880-6360 (Supported by CAPECO)


