
## Weston: A Umatilla County Historical Treasure



The Umatilla County Historical Society welcomes ALL to their 2018 exhibit featuring the community of Weston, Oregon. The exhibit's title honors a rich legacy, Weston: A Umatilla County Historical Treasure.

Founded in 1865, the city of Weston is the oldest city in Umatilla County. A significant part of the exhibit focuses on the early history of Weston. It is a story told through many wonderful historic photographs and a treasure trove of carefully researched stories about the community

A highlight of the exhibit features many pioneer names – the families who settled in Weston during the 1800s. You may find your family ancestors among these names.

The historic Weston Brick Yard occupies a full exhibit panel. The Isham Saling House is also featured, as well as many other historic buildings. And no story of the community would be complete without "Pride of Weston" – the Normal School.



The story of a vital Weston community continues into the present day with the growth of new businesses, Weston Middle School, and, of course, the heart of the community, the Weston Public Library.

The exhibit was developed by Kathy Wilson, Heritage Station Volunteer and accomplished researcher.

The Isham Saling House, built in 1880, is the largest historic brick house in Weston, Oregon Speaker: Sheldon Delph -- A former resident of Weston, Oregon

You will enjoy his presentation and his many pictures and stories about the Isham Saling House History. Sheldon prepared the nomination Data Form required by the National Register Criteria. He worked tirelessly in his research of the Isham Saling House, and the history of the community.

On January 1, 1976, the Isham Saling House was granted eligibility from the National Park Service to be included on the National Register of Historic Places List in the State of Oregon. Sheldon is also on the restoration project for the Isham Saling House.
