

Board of Directors held the regular monthly meeting at the District office on August 16, 2018. The minutes from the July 26, 2018 meeting were approved. The July 2018 Treasurer's Report was accepted, and the August 2018 bills were approved for payment.

The District has posted the job listing for Administrator/Paramedic and there are four candidates.

Administrator Rost will set up an interview schedule as soon as possible.

The District has purchased two new Zoll heart monitors and has grants out to obtain other needed equipment. If you are downtown after dark you will have noticed our building sign is working. Within the next few days, Creative Signs will replace the old name panels with new ones. We are also having new lettering on our office doors.

Jeremy Lasater, position #5, submitted his letter of resignation to the Board on July 26, 2018 and it was accepted. There is a position open on the Board and if you are interested in serving, please send a letter of interest to the District. The Board meets once a month with special meeting or work session occasionally. The Board is looking to purchase a new ambulance and do some building upgrades soon.

As of August 21, 2018, we have received 164 calls for service. With school starting soon, please be extra careful as you drive-watch out for youngsters going to and from school. Also, as the road work is being done on Highway #11, please drive slowly through road construction zones.

The next meeting is set for September 19, 2018 at 7:00 p.m.
