Book Group for Grownups

Around 15 years ago a few avid readers asked if Weston Library could form a book discussion group. These folks began meeting the last Thursday evening of each month. We call this group "Novel Readers."

Here's how it works. The librarian rounds up multiple copies of the selected book, members check them out and read on their own. Then we meet in the library for a discussion.

Over the years, we have read a diverse list of about 75 books. We began by selecting novels, thus the name of our group. Since then, we have branched out to include nonfiction, young adult books, and genre fiction. What qualities make a book a good candidate for discussion? The most important criteria are that the book be well

written, have an interesting plot, and three-dimensional characters. A good book often stays in the reader's mind long after the book is finished and the discussion is over. We don't always agree about how much we liked or disliked the book, but that makes for a lively discussion!
